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GENERAL TECHNICAL RULES



1. Time and Duration

The 52nd International Children's Games will take place from July 29 to August 3rd in Jerusalem, Israel.

2. Program

The programme of the 52nd International Children's Games includes the following disciplines:

2.1 Summer Sports

- TEAM SPORTS: Basketball, Streetball, Football (Soccer), Volleyball
- INDIVIDUAL SPORTS: Athletics - Track & Field, Judo, Swimming, Tennis, Fencing

3. Participants (Delegates: Up To 24)

- Participating athletes must reside or attend school in the city in which they represent.
- Athletes must be 12 years old by January 1 the year of the Games and must still be maximum 15 years old, on December 31 the year of the Games.

4. Identity Card, Control and Sanctions

- All participants of the Games (athletes, coaches, other participants) need to have identification cards, made by the organizer of the Games. The ID card has to include the Participant's photo, sports, the First and last name, City and Country.
- The Head of the delegation is obliged to give the accurate data for the ID cards.

The Head of the Delegation needs to assure the insight into the legal documents of the participants in the case of any complaint, therefore it is advisable to bring the copy of the documents to the Games.

- In the case of fraud, the City will be obliged to pay all penalty expenses and fines imposed by the Executive Committee of ICG.
- The Referee of appointed discipline as well as the Head of Competition must inspect the athlete's ID card before commencing the competition.

5. Technical Meetings

- Joint technical meeting for all disciplines will take place at least a day before the technical

meeting of individual disciplines. At the meeting the Heads of Competition and the members of ICG TC will take part.

- Before the beginning of competition, the technical meeting of individual disciplines is summoned. At the meeting the Heads of Competition and the members of ICG TC as well as the coaches will take part.

6. Authority and Jurisdiction

- A Head of Delegation may file a sport protest. To do so they will follow the Sport Protest procedure for the International Children's Games.
- All sport protests will be heard and either denied or investigated by the ICG Protest Committee.
- All decisions by the Protest Committee are final and binding.
- Sport protests must be initiated, in writing, by the city's Head of Delegation 33 hours after the occurrence which is the subject of the protest. The protest must provide the details necessary for the Committee's review and should be submitted to the

submitted to the head referee for each sport or anyone of the Protest Committee members.

- All protests require a 100 Euros (or equivalent other currency) protest fee to be paid to the ICG before a protest will be heard. Only one protest by a city's Head of Delegation can be filed per sport incident.
- If the Head of Delegation refuses, or is unable to submit a protest in writing, the Protest Committee may exercise its discretion and investigate the protest.
- Subject to any limits imposed either by law or by this procedure, information (whether oral or written) which is created, gathered, received, or compiled through the course of an investigation will be treated as confidential by all involved in the investigation and adjudication of the protest.

7. Others

- No changes can be made to any part of the ICG THs without the consent of the Technical Commission

ATHLETICS (TRACK & FIELD)

JULY 31 - AUGUST 2, 2018



The 52nd International Children's Games will take place from July 29th to August 3rd in Jerusalem, Israel.

1. Venue

Venue - The new Stadium of Givat ram, Jerusalem

2. Identification

All athletes must show their accreditation cards with a photo; without this card an athlete cannot compete.

3. Competition Rules

- Each city may register a maximum number of 8 girls and 8 boys and a minimum of 2 girls and 2 boys.
- Maximum 2 athletes from each team are allowed to participate in one event.
- Each athlete may compete in two events and in the 4 x 100m Relay.

- Girls running 800 m and boys running 1500m are not allowed to compete in any other discipline the same day of their middle distance competition.
- Athletics events: 100m, 400m, 800m (girls only), 1500m (boys only), long jump, high jump, shot put, 4x100m relay.
- Number of coaches: One for each boy's team, one for each girl's team.
- Personal best performance from each athlete will be required during registration for seeding purposes.
- Uniforms: Athletes must wear the uniform of their city.
- Competition numbers will be given to Team Managers/Coaches, who will be responsible for issuing bib numbers to all athletes in their team. The competition numbers must be worn firmly attached to the front and the back of the uniform with no less than four (4) pins so that the entire number and logo can be easily seen. No part of the number can be folded.

- Hip numbers will be provided by an official at the start of events requiring them.
- If an athlete fails to scratch from an event after confirmation, she/he may not be permitted to compete in any other event in the Games including relays (See IAAF Rule 142.4)
- The competition will take place according to IAAF Rules and ICG Rules.

4. Call Room

- There will be a call room in operation.
- All athletes must report to the call room on time with their competition numbers attached to their uniform.
- In the call room athletes will be expected to demonstrate that their competition uniform, singlet and numbers, shoes and other equipment comply with the completion rules.
- Please do not take unnecessary items into the call room like mobile phones, ipods etc.

as they will be confiscated.

- Athletes will proceed to the start of their event from the call room ACCOMPANIED BY A CALL ROOM JUDGE OR FIELD EVENT OFFICIAL. Athletes who proceed to the event not accompanied by a judge or official may not be allowed to start.
- The closing Call Entry Times at the call room are: (prior to scheduled event starting times)
 - Jumping and throwing events: 40 min.
 - Running events: 30 min.
- The composition of a team and the order of running for a relay shall be officially declared 90 min prior to relay scheduled event starting times.
- This time allows for marshaling and movements to the competition site. The remainder of the time may be used to complete the warm up at the competition site where the competition site is not in use (under supervision of the officials).
- If an athlete is already, or is likely to

be, competing in another event at the designated call time, the athlete or his/her team official must notify the Call Room of this circumstance prior to the designated call time.

- Athletes who will fail to be at the call room on time will be suspended!
- Warm up: Athletes may warm up in the designated area.
- Starting Blocks: must be used by all athletes in the 100m, 400m and relay. These will be supplied by the venue. No private blocks will be permitted.
- False start: Each athlete responsible for a false start will be disqualified (IAAF 162.7)
- Shoes: The sole and heel of the shoe may be constructed so that they can accommodate up to 11 spikes. Any number of spikes between 0 and 11 may be used, but the number of spike positions cannot exceed 11. The protecting portion of the spike should not be longer than 9 mm. Exception is high jump, where the length of more than 12 mm is not allowed. The spike point must be so designed, that at least half of the length measured from the tip of the spike, fits into a square mold with straight sides of 4 mm.

5. Qualification

5.1 100m:

- Qualification: 8 heats, the first place of each heat and the 16 fastest runners for semi-final.
- 24 runners will advance to the semi-final. Advancement procedures will be set upon receipt of final entries.
- Semi-final: 3 heats, the first two places from each heat, and the two fastest runners will progress to the A final, and

the second eight fastest runners will progress to the B final.

- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

5.2 400m:

- Qualification: - If the total number of participating is less than 32, then first place of each heat and the 4 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- If the total number of teams participating is greater than 32, then 8 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

5.3 800m (girls only):

- Qualification: 6 heats, the first place of each heat and 2 fastest runners will progress to the final A, and the next eight fastest runners will progress to the final B
- Girls participating in the 800m run are not entitled to participate in another event on the same day.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

5.4 1500m (boysonly):

- Qualification: 5 heats, the first two places of each heat and 2 fastest runners will progress to the final A, and the next eight fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- Boys participating in the 1500m run are not entitled to participate in another event on the same day.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

5.5 Long Jump:

- Qualification standard: Girls 5.00m, Boys 5.80m
- Qualification: each athlete has three attempts. All competitors who reach or exceed the qualification standard will progress to the final. If less than 12 athletes reach the qualification standard, the 12 best performances of qualification groups will progress to the final.
- Final: the best 8 athletes after three attempts will have three further attempts.

5.6 HighJump:

- Qualification standard: Girls 1.55 m, Boys 1.65 m
- Qualification: All the competitors who will clear the above-mentioned qualifying standard reach the final. If less than 12 competitors jump the standard, the next best athletes in order will progress the final (until number of 12 competitors is reached).
- The heights for the qualifications:
Girls: 1.30, 1.35, 1.40, 1.45, 1.50, 1.55
Boys: 1.45, 1.50, 1.55, 1.60, 1.65
- The heights for the final:
Girls: 1.40, 1.45, 1.50, 1.55, +3 cm
Boys: 1.55, 1.60, 1.65, 1.70, 1.75, +3cm

5.7 Shot Put:

- The shot weights are:
Boys: 5 kg
Girls: 3kg
- Shots will be provided by the organizers. For athletes wishing to use their own shot, the implement must be lodged with the Technical Manager at the equipment room by 9:00am on the day of competition in which your event

is to be held. The implements will be impounded until after the competition when athletes may collect them from the equipment room. Any competitor may use all implements in the pool.

- Qualification standard: Girls 10.00m, Boys 12.00m
- Qualification: each athlete has three attempts. All competitors who reach or exceed the qualification standard will progress to the final. If less than 12 athletes reach the qualification standard, the 12 best performances of qualification groups will progress to the final.
- Final: the best 8 athletes after three attempts will have three further attempts.

5.8 4x100m RELAY:

- If the total number of teams participating in 4x100m Relay is less than 32, semi-finals be not organized and the first place of each heat and the 4 fastest runners for final A and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- If the total number of teams participating is greater than 32, then : 24 teams will advance to the semi-final - the first place of each heat and the fastest runners.
- Semi-final: 3 heats, the first two places from each heat, and the two fastest runners will progress to the A final, and the second eight fastest runners will progress to the B final.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

6. Disputes

- Any disputes will be resolved in compliance

with IAAF rules and the clauses included in the ICG Sports Rules.

- Any disputes will be heard by the Protest Committee.
- Protests must be lodged initially with the Referee at the event as per IAAF rules. Appeals to the Jury are to be made in writing, signed by a responsible official on behalf of the athlete and submitted within 30 minutes after the official announcement of the decision made by the referee and lodged with a deposit of USD 100, not returned if the protest is unsuccessful.

7. Disciplinary Rules

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be adhered

to at all times. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behavior; offence made through words and/or actions, violent behavior, and abusive language.

- All delegations have to comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behavior of their athletes at all times.

8. Presentation of Medals

- The following Medals will be awarded:

Gold: For individuals and relay teams ranking first place in the competition.

Silver: For individuals and relay teams

ranking second place in the competition.

Bronze: For individuals and relay teams ranking third place in the competition.

- Medals will only be awarded to the first three athletes/teams in the A Finals.
- Medal presentations will be made at designated times as per schedule. Athletes must wear their competition uniform or team tracksuit for the ceremony. Team coaches are requested to assist in ensuring athletes are readily available and correctly dressed.

9. Pre competition training

Practice is on July 30.

10. Medical

- First aid will be available on site. At this first aid station, a doctor, a nurse, a physical therapist and an ambulance will be present and available for all participants.
- Serious cases will be referred to one of the hospitals in Jerusalem.

11. Technical Meeting

Technical meeting will be held on July 30, 9 am at Bait Vagan Guesthouse.

12. Competition Schedule

BASKETBALL

(5 ON 5)
JULY 31 - AUGUST 2, 2018



1. Venue

Seligsberg Sports Gym - 29 David Raziell St,
Malha Sports Center - 3 Avraham Stern St,
Denmark Sports Gym - 26 Yehuda ha-Nasi St.

2. Court

- The game will be played on a court of a regular FIBA basketball playing court.
- The court shall have a regular basketball playing court sized zone, including a free throw line (5.80m), a three point line (6.75m) and a no-charge semi-circle area underneath the basket

3. Identification

All athletes must show their accreditation cards with photos - An athlete will not be permitted to compete without the accreditation.

4. Competition information

4.1 Teams

- Number of teams that can participate: 16

Boy's teams and 8 girl's teams

- Each team shall consist of a maximum of eight (8) players (5 players on the court and 3 substitutes) and one (1) coach.
- Number of coaches: One (1) for Boy's team & One (1) for Girl's team.

4.2 Game Officials

- The game officials shall be two (2) referees assisted by two (2) table officials, namely a scorer, a timer and a 24 seconds operator.

4.3 Basketball apparel

- Basketball Teams must have a minimum of two sets of shirts as well as basketball shoes, socks, shorts, t-shirt. All equipment used by players must be appropriate for the game.
- Any equipment that is designed to increase a players' height or reach or in any other way give an unfair advantage is not permitted.

4.4 Ball size

- 7 for boys and 6 for girls

4.5 Playing time/Winner of a Game

- Each game will consist of 4 quarters of 8 min include stopping time. Last two min on the last quarter include stopping time.
- Half time duration: 8 minutes
- Duration between the quarters: 2 min
- Warm up duration: 10 minutes
- If two teams involved in a tie score at the end of playing time the game shall continue with as many extra time periods of two (2) minutes as is necessary to break the tie. Extra time period for the finals only will be three (3) minutes, include stopping time.
- (2) Two points awarded for a win
- One for a loss
- Technical loss - 0 points

4.6 Fouls by Player/Fouls by Team

- A player who has committed five (5) fouls personal or technical shall be informed thereof by the referee and must leave the game immediately.
- Each team shall do its best to secure victory, but this must done in the spirit of sportsmanship and fair play.

Any deliberate or repeated non co-operation or non-compliance with the spirit of this rule shall be considered as a technical foul.

- A team shall lose a game by default if, during the game, the team has fewer than two players on the playing court ready to play.
- A team foul will be 7 each quarter, after 7 two free throw.

4.7 Game lost by forfeit:

- The game is awarded to the opponents and the score shall be twenty to zero (20-0). Athletes will be excluded from the games for indecent behavior, offence provided by words or actions, violent behavior, abusive language.

4.8 Twenty four second device

- The team must attempt a shot for a field goal within 24 seconds.

4.9 Substitutions

- Teams are allowed to proceed to unlimited number of substitutions according the FIBA regulations. During a

game only the coach and the players has to be in the field of play

4.10 Time-outs

Team have one time-out each quarter and one in over time.

4.11 Groups

- The tournament will begin with four (4) groups for boys and two (2) groups for girls on July 31 and will end on August 2nd with the final four at the Malha Sports Center. Each group will consist of four (4) (or more) teams into which competing cities have been randomly assigned.
- The top two teams (higher position) from each of the four groups will play in the quarter final. The winner's teams from the four games will play for the semifinal. The teams that they lose play for 3rd and 4th place and the winners for the gold medal in the final game.
- In the group phase that two or more teams have the same number of points then the winner (top team) will be decided by the following in this order:
 1. Head to head games
 2. Points difference
 3. Number of points scored divided by

the points conceded (points ratio)

- For the needs of training, the athletes will be able to use the same venue (or any other) on July 30.

5. Disputes

Any disputes will be resolved in compliance with FIBA rules and the clauses included in the ICG Sports Rules. Any disputes will be heard by the Basketball Appeals Coordinator and the Protest Committee.

6. Medical

A First Aid Service will be available on site. Full Medical Service will be available at one of the hospitals in Jerusalem.

7. Technical meeting

The technical meeting for Basketball competition will be held on the July 30, 9 am at Bait Vagan Guesthouse. If it's necessary, we will proceed to another technical meeting in order to ensure the quality of the Competition.

8. Essential information

- All the teams must be at the court 45 minutes before the designated fixture. Teams
- (Coaches, Players) should arrive at basketball venue with the necessary accreditation. All delegation must to comply with any indication made by the venue staff, without creating any kind of problem to other teams. For any issue or protest, the Head of Delegation has to contact the competition manager immediately. If anything negative is observed, we request immediate report to the department responsible person.

9. Disciplinary Rules

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be adhered to at all times. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations have to comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.

10. Medals

- The following Medals will be awarded:

GOLD – for team ranking first in the competition

SILVER – for team ranking second in the competition

BRONZE – for team ranking third in the competition

STREETBALL

(3 ON 3)
JULY 31 - AUGUST 2, 2018



1. Venue

Safra Square

2. Court

- The game will be played on a court (size 12X12) playing with one (1) basket.
- The court shall have a regular basketball playing court sized zone, including a free throw line (5.80m), a two point line (6.75m) and a no-charge semi-circle area underneath the one basket

3. Identification

All athletes must show their accreditation cards with photos - An athlete will not be permitted to compete without the accreditation.

4. Competition information

4.1 Teams

- Number of teams that can participate: 32 Boy's teams and 24 girl's teams
- Each team shall consist of a maximum of

four (4) players (3 players on the court and 1 substitute) and one (1) coach.

- Number of coaches: One (1) for Boy's team & One (1) for Girl's team.

4.2 Game Officials

- The game officials shall be one (1) referee assisted by three (3) table officials, namely a scorer, a timer and a twelve (12) second operator.

4.3 Basketball apparel

- Basketball Teams must have a minimum of two sets of shirts as well as basketball shoes, socks, shorts, t-shirt. All equipment used by players must be appropriate for the game.
- Any equipment that is designed to increase a players' height or reach or in any other way give an unfair advantage is not permitted.

4.4 Ball size

- 7 for boys and 6 for girls

4.5 Beginning of the Game

- Both teams shall warm-up (3 minutes)

simultaneously.

- Before the game, a player from team A will take a 3-point shot. If made team A shall begin
- The game with a throw-in, if not, it will be team B. The team that did not start the game
- Shall be entitled to the ball at the next jump ball situation in accordance with the alternating
- Possession arrow rule. The arrow will be directed to the bench of the team which is entitled to the ball at the next alternating possession opportunity.

4.6 Playing time/Winner of a Game

- The regular playing time shall be 12min(10 min not include stopping time + 2 last min include stopping time).
- The clock shall be stopped during dead ball situations and free throws. The clock shall be restarted after the exchange of the ball is completed (as soon as it is in the offensive team's hands).
- However the first team which scores 21 or more points wins the game if it

happens before the end of a regular playing time. This rule applies to regular playing time only (not in a potential overtime).

- If the score is tied at the end of playing time, an extra period of time will be played. There shall be an Interval of one (1) minute before the overtime starts. The first team to score two (2) points in the overtime wins the game.

4.7 Fouls by Player/Fouls by Team

- A team is in a team foul situation when it has committed seven (7) fouls.
- A player who has committed four (4) fouls must leave the game.
- Fouls during the act of shooting inside the arc shall be awarded with one (1) free throw.
- Fouls during the act of shooting behind the arc shall be awarded with two (2) free throws.
- Fouls during the act of shooting followed by a successful field goal shall be awarded one (1) additional free-throw.
- Non-shooting fouls under penalty foul

situation shall be awarded with one (1) free throw.

4.8 Twelve second device

- The team must attempt a shot for a field goal within 12 seconds.

4.9 Stalling

- Stalling or failing to play actively by attempting to score shall be a violation.
- A team must attempt a shot within twelve (12) seconds. the game starts only after basket was scored over the 3 point's line and not underneath the basket.
- If the court is not equipped with a shot clock and a team is not sufficiently trying to attack the basket, the referee shall give them a warning by counting the last 5 seconds.

4.10 How the Ball is played

- Following each successful field goal or last free throw:

A player from a non-scoring team will resume the game by passing the ball from the place directly from the court underneath the basket (not from behind the end line) to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point line, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line.

- Following each unsuccessful field goal or last free throw:

If the offensive team rebound the ball, it may continue to attempt the score without returning the ball to behind the three-point line.

- If the defensive team rebound the ball, it must return the ball (by passing or dribbling) behind the three-point line.
- Once the ball is behind the three-point line at least one additional pass must be

made to a teammate before an attempt to score is made.

- Following the steal, turnover etc:
If it happens within the two-point area, the ball must be passed/dribbled to a place behind the three-point line. Once the ball is behind the three-point line, at least one additional passes must be made to a teammate before the attempt to score is made.
- Should the first offensive player who has dribbled/received the ball at a place behind the three-point line attempt to score, it is a violation.
- All throw-ins following the fouls (without free throws), violations, out-of bounds, at the beginning of the first period and of the extra period shall be taken from the out-of-bounds place level with the top of the three-point line, closest to the infraction. The places shall be marked in out-of-bounds by 5 cm line. The referee shall hand the ball to the out-of-bound player. The thrower-in must pass the ball to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line
- Dunking of the ball is not permitted unless pressure-released rings are used.

4.11 Substitutions

The substitution shall be permitted when the ball becomes dead and the game clock is stopped.

4.12 Time-outs

There are no time-outs granted to any team at any time.

4.13 Groups:

- All groups will split to houses of 4 groups each while the first 2 go to the next level.
- In the group phase that two or more teams have the same number of points

then the winner (top team) will be decided by the following in this order:

1. Head to head games
2. Points difference
3. Number of points scored divided by the points conceded (points ratio).

5. Disputes

Any disputes will be resolved in compliance with FIBA rules and the clauses included in the ICG Sports Rules. Any disputes will be heard by the streetball Appeals Coordinator and the Protest Committee.

6. Medical

A First Aid Service will be available on site. Full Medical Service will be available at one of the hospitals in Jerusalem.

7. Technical meeting

The technical meeting for streetball competition will be held on July 30, 9 am at Bait Vagan Guesthouse. If it's necessary, we will proceed to another technical meeting in order to ensure the quality of the Competition.

FOOTBALL (SOCCER)

JULY 31 - AUGUST 2, 2018



1. Venue

Emek Ha-Arazim – 6 fields

2. Identification

All athletes must show their accreditation cards with photos and the sport - without that card athlete cannot compete.

3. Competition Information

- There will be separate tournaments for girls and boys teams.
- Number of teams that can participate: 16 Boy's teams and 16 girl's teams
- One coach per team is allowed.
- Teams will consist of 6~8 players 1 of which will be a goalkeeper.
- Both the boy's team and the girl's team have a separate coach.
- Shin guards are required for all competitors.
- The venue is outdoor. Players must wear

proper soccer cleats/shoes/boots. (Baseball type cleats are not allowed).

- Athletes are prohibited to wear neither any footwear with metal studs nor glasses/sunglasses during a game unless sports/plastic/protective glasses.

4. Competition Rules

- The rules of the tournament will be FIFA rules modified for small-sided games.
- Depending on the number of entries, teams will be entered into pools of up to 4 teams.
- The pitch size will be 50-65 m by 40-45 m
- **No offside rule** will be operated
- The ball used will be a size 5.
- Each game will consist of 2 halves of 20 minutes each. Half-time break is 10 minutes.
- Warm up duration: 10 minutes.
- Team size consists of 6 players: (5 players that includes 1 Captain) and 1 goalkeeper

- Goal length 4,8-6 m and height 1,9-2 m.
- Competitions within group are lead by 1 referee. Quarter finals, semifinals and final game will be lead by 2 referees.
- A system of rolling substitutions will apply.
- A timekeeper is required, controlling the duration of the games, using a horn/hooter as no injury time is allowed, except in the Final, which is at the discretion of the referee(s).
- The area between pitches should be kept clear for teams and officials only, with spectators viewing only from the opposite side.
- Throw-ins are allowed.
- Slide tackles are not allowed (punishable with a yellow card), but sliding to score, or to stop the ball going out of play or to stop a goal, is allowed.
- The normal football back-pass rule applies.
- Goals cannot be scored directly from a kick-off.

- A team does not show up for their first game will be disqualified from the tournament but allowed to play the scheduled fixtures as "friendlies" at the discretion of the Tournament Director and the opposing teams.
- All team members wear the same football strip.

5. Preliminary Rounds

- Each team will play all other teams in their pool once. Depending on the pool size and structure, the top teams will go forward to the Medal Rounds while the remaining teams will play an additional consolation game.
- In pool games, 3 points will be awarded for a win and 1 point for a draw.
- The top 2 teams in each group will advance to the quarter finals.
- In the case that teams in the same pool have the same number of points, the final standings will be decided by the following

order:

- Head to head between the teams concerned.
- Goal difference resulting from the group matches ONLY between the teams concerned;
- Greater number of goals scored in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned;
- Lower number of goals against in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned;
- If still undecided, the winner will be decided by a coin flip by the Head Referee

6. Medal Round

- The quarter-finals will be between the top teams in the Pool Round. The winners of one pool will play against the runner up in the another pool.
- The Semi-finals will be between the 4 quarter-finals winners
- The final will be between the 2 semi-final winners.
- In the event of a draw at quarter-final, semi-final or final games at the end of regulation play, there will be 2 x 5 minute periods of extra time followed by penalty kicks.
- In the event of a game going to penalties, any 5 from the full squad can take the first

5 penalties before moving to the rest of the squad if required. Squads for penalties shall be determined by the team with the lower number of players. The goalkeeper who finished the game must be in goal for at least the first penalty.

- If a team is permanently reduced to 4 players due to sending offs, the game will end and the match will be awarded 2-0

to their opponents, unless the score, as it stands at that point, is more advantageous to their opponents.

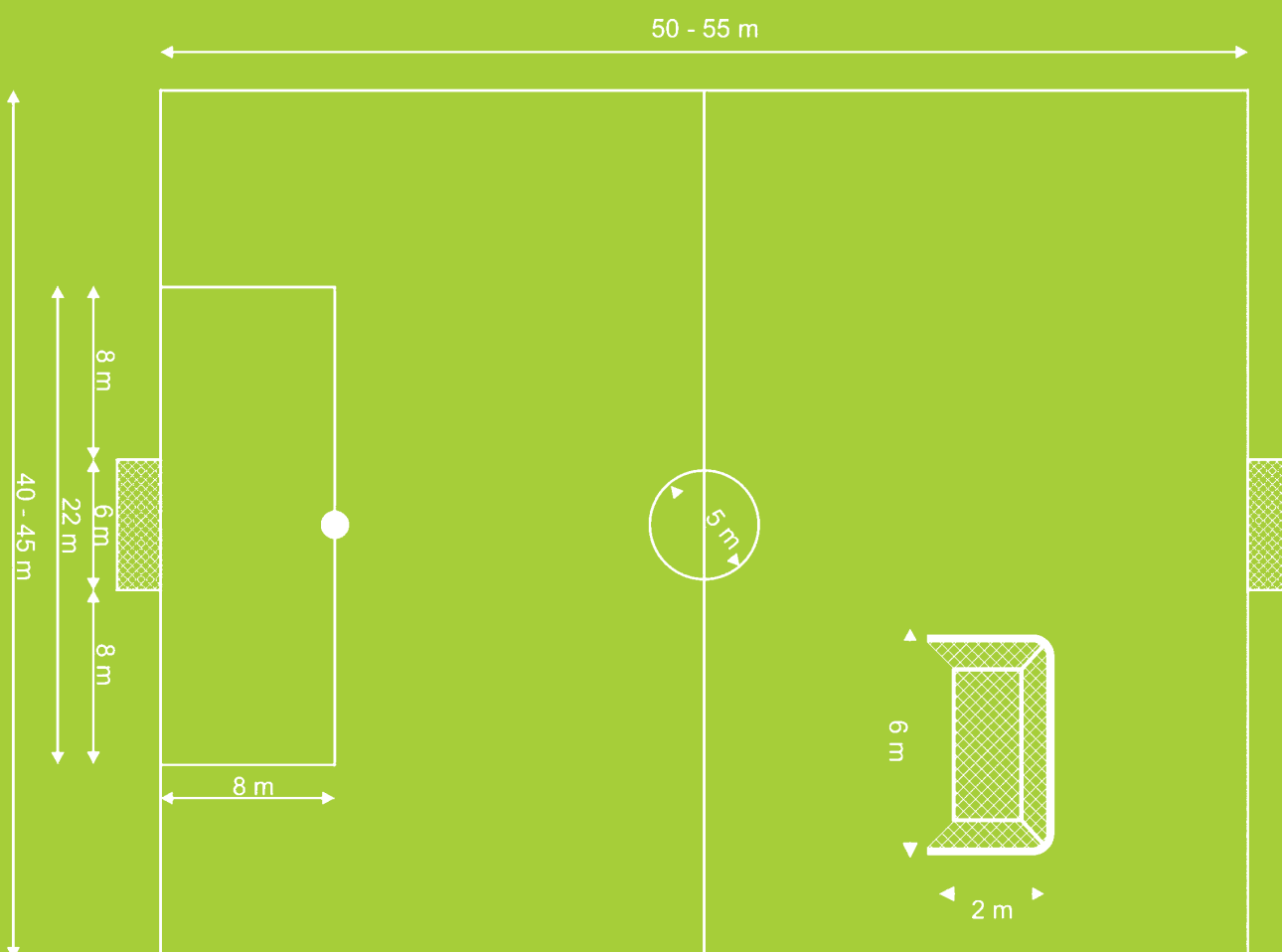
